

# Cranberries and Cystitis

**DID YOU KNOW** the use of cranberry is a natural way to assist in reducing the risk of urinary tract infection? It's not just an old wife's tale. A urinary tract infection (UTI) is a bacterial infection in the bladder or urethra. The urethra is the tube urine exits through leaving the body. Female dogs are prone to UTIs, especially if they have been spayed or if a female is a "low squatter." **Symptoms of a UTI:**

- Blood in the urine, a strong or different urine odor, and looks cloudy or darker.
- Accidents in the house, a female dog squatting or a male lifting his leg repeatedly with no urine.
- Leaving small spots of urine or nothing, or signs of pain, distress, straining, or whining while trying to go.
- Excessive genital area grooming.
- A lump in the lower stomach can be a collection of urine. Depending bladder fullness, the lump can be tender to the touch.
- Drinking more water than normal.

If you've noticed any of the above symptoms, take your dog to your vet! A UTI can do serious damage and can be hard to treat successfully due to increasing bacterial resistance to antibiotics. E. Coli bacteria causes 85%-90% of UTIs. It is important to ask your veterinarian to submit your dog's urine samples for culture and sensitivity testing. This determines the bacteria causing the infection and the antibiotics it is most susceptible and resistant to. Your vet can select the best antibiotic and it decreases the chance of antibiotic failure. Timely and effective treatment of lower urinary tract infections is important because it can prevent complications caused by long standing urinary tract infections such as ascending infection to the kidneys and the formation of struvite bladder stones.

E. Coli use their p-type fimbriae (an appendage of proteins) to attach to the wall of the urinary tract. The A Type proanthocyanidins (flavanoids and tannins) found in cranberries have been clinically demonstrated to attach to E. Coli fimbriae (proteins) and prevent the bacteria from attaching to the urinary tract and bladder. Remember that cranberry won't clear up an existing UTI but may help prevent a UTI only.

If your dog is having UTIs and/or you are supplementing with cranberry is it good to check the pH level of your dog's urine. You can buy pH strips at the drug store. A high urine pH (over 7.0 is alkaline urine) or low (not lower than 6.2 – acidic urine) with no other symptoms does not necessarily mean a problem, but if combined with a symptom(s), have your dog checked for a UTI, stones and crystalluria among other possible problems. A neutral range of 6.5 – 7.0 will keep problems at bay. Two factors can be the amount of times the dog is fed daily and high carbohydrates – both effect the pH balance. One meal a day can lead to an unacceptable acidic level (6.2 or lower), or high carbohydrates (grains) can lead to an unacceptable alkaline level (7.0 or higher.) Cranberry may help bring the range back into normal.



The easiest way to give cranberry to your pet is in capsule or pill form. You can give your dog capsules or pills made for humans. The recommended dose on the package is usually for an adult who weighs more than a pet. Discuss cranberry with your vet before starting your dog on cranberry supplements or the actual fruit in any form. It *can* hurt your dog if there are other particular pre-existing issues.

## Rescue Remedy for Pets

Another tried and true homeopathic tool Irish Wolfhound owners use is Rescue Remedy for Pets (a paw print is on the box.) Rescue Remedy is a 5X diluted homeopathic remedy made from Impatiens, Clematis, Rock Rose, Cherry Plum and Star of Bethlehem. It remedies stress, distress, tension, and restores calm, reassurance and relaxation. It is often used for an immediate calming effect in any stressful situation, anxious behavior, or when your pet needs help overcoming a variety of emotional or behavioral problems such as visits to the vet, fear of loud noises, excessive barking, shock, trauma, or mistreatment, adapting to the loss of a companion, separation anxiety, adapting to a new home or surroundings, obsessive cleanliness, constant licking or nibbling of self, and more.



It is available in alcohol-free 10 ml drops or non-aerosol 20 ml spray, which contains 27% alcohol as a preservative and has a sweet flavor. For use with dogs, cats, and horses. The dosage size is the same for all sizes of pets - 4 drops into your pet's food or water or directly into your pet's mouth as needed to help relieve stress. There should be a difference within about 30 minutes. If no results you can safely give a second dose. Ask your Vet first if you want to administer it to a pregnant or lactating bitch. As with any product, use at the published dose and monitor your dog's behavior.



# Green Tripe: The Good, The Bad, and... The Smelly!

**What is Tripe?** Tripe is the stomach of ruminating animals. Ruminants are hoofed animals with four chamber stomachs and eats grass. Examples of ruminants are cows, sheep, goats, bison, deer, llamas, giraffe and camels.

**What is Green Tripe?** "Green" Tripe does not refer to its color. The color is mostly a brownish grey, maybe with a greenish tint. Green Tripe means that the tripe has not been bleached, scalded, or processed. It cannot be bought in supermarkets or the local butcher shop. The tripe at these places is for human consumption. It has been cleaned and has no nutritional value at all. It has a rubbery texture, serving it in large chunks aids in strengthening its jaw muscles and also has an added benefit as a form of canine dental floss.



**The Good:** The gastric juices and enzymes from the Green Tripe aid in animal digestion. It helps with sensitive stomachs and maladies such as Irritable Bowel Syndrome and Inflammatory Bowel Disease. Healthy muscle development is supported by the naturally occurring amino acids. Gastric juices clean the teeth and when feed whole, it acts as a dental floss. It contains EFA's, Linoleic and Linolenic in their recommended proportions of Omega 3's and 6's which promotes a healthy coat and aids in brain functioning. It also contains Lactobacillus Acidophilus (Lactic Acid) which is the main ingredient in probiotics. It has been recommended for dogs suffering from Chronic Renal Failure and kidney disease due to its low phosphorus levels and palatability.



**The Bad:** Green Tripe is smelly and I mean smelly. There really is no way around that. At our house, Green Tripe is fed outside. It helps to keep the smell down in the house quite a bit. Some worry about salmonella and E.coli. Remember canines are designed to eat raw meat. When cutting Tripe, it is very important to clean all surface and utensils thoroughly. The dogs may not get sick, but humans can.

## Traumeel

**A Note from Dr. Regina Schwabe, D.V.M., via Heather Burns**

She is certified by the International Veterinary Acupuncture Society and the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association. Her mission is to improve the health, well-being and functional longevity of patients using swim therapy, chiropractic, acupuncture, physical therapy, nutrition and homeopathy in a state-of-the-art referral setting. An IW owner and friend recommended that I ask for Dr. Schwabe's advice on the use of Traumeel for our newsletter and here it is:



"Traumeel is a homeopathic combination remedy (commonly found at health food stores or the internet) and very useful for soft tissue injuries of all kinds. In dogs, we usually use the oral tablet, crushed so that it is absorbed by the mucous membranes of the mouth, or the pediatric liquid which can be sprinkled right on the gums. It is actually used in human sports medicine for sprains and strains and bruising. The cream form is great for people with bruises, contusions, etc. but not practical in dogs normally because of the hair. We have used it in short-coated dogs. I recommend my clients keep it on hand for the inevitable day-to-day injuries as well as those that may occur because of a sporting performance such as agility or lure-coursing. People find it useful for body aches."


